For those who were unable to participate, Dan Jimenez, RXCadre Project Manager, gave an overview of this integrated research project that provides data for modeling fuels, atmospheric conditions, fire behavior, smoke, and fire effects. Our discussion also addressed benefits of, and ways of incorporating, manager feedback into research proposal development; the role of experimental forests and variation among them; accelerated restoration across large, multiforest landscapes; the role of collaboration; updating fire plans to include current terminology; and a report on the Northern Rockies Fire Science Network's recent field trip on integrated fuel treatment in Priest River, Idaho.
